Local historian Dick Dixon will be on hand to sign copies of his book, *Smokestack: The Story of the Salida Smelter*. Local artist Jon MacManus will be selling his ink drawings and greeting cards featuring the smokestack. John McCarthy, local railroad historian, will speak in the afternoon about the smelter's dependence on the railroad for incoming and outgoing ore shipments. ## Did You Know...

By 1916, the Ohio & Colorado Smelting and Refining Company was operating a custom lead smelter in Smelertown that processed almost \$3 million worth of ore. They employed 595 men, paying an average salary of \$2,365 per year for full-time workers, and they offered free life insurance with a policy of \$750 for each married man and \$500 for each single man. In 1917, they built the 365-foot stack, which still stands today, to disperse toxic fumes away from ranches and livestock.

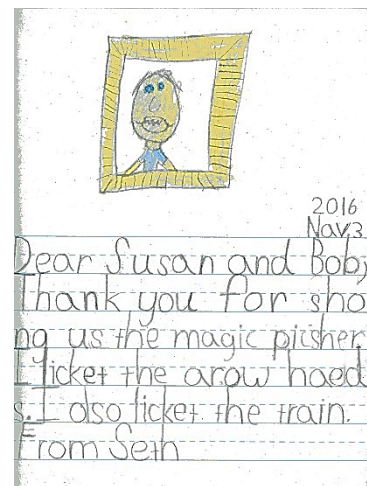
